Official Cornhole Rules

The cornhole boards are 27 feet apart – front to front

There are 8 bags, 4 of each color. All 8 bags begin on one end.

There are 2 teams of 2 people. Partners stand at opposite cornhole boxes on the same side. Your partner throws directly across from you.

A coin flip decides who throws first.

A cornhole player may throw from anywhere behind the front of the cornhole box they are throwing from. Your feet may not go past the front edge of the board.

You alternate throwing bags until all 8 bags have been thrown. (You throw one bag, your opponent throws one bag, etc.)

A tossed bag may not touch the ground. If it hits the ground and bounces up on to the board, remove it before any other bags are thrown.

When all 8 bags have been tossed to the other side, add up the score.

- 3 points for a cornhole bag that goes through the hole.
- 1 point for a cornhole bag that is on the playing surface.
- 1 point for a cornhole bag that is hanging into the hole.
- 1 point for a cornhole bag that is hanging off the edge but not touching the ground.
- 0 points for a cornhole bag that is on the board but also touching the ground.

At the end of each round, add up how many points you earned and compare them to your opponents.

- Equal points cancel each other out so that only one team can score per round.
- For example, if you scored 5 points and your opponent scored 3 points, you will add 2 points to your overall score and your team will throw first in the next round.
- If you scored 6 points and your opponent scored 6 as well, there will be no points awarded and whoever threw first on the last round will throw first again.

If you earned the most points in that single round, your team will throw first in the next round.

A game is won when a team reaches 21 or more points.
